- b. Report from Quality Assessment and Performance Improvement (QAPI) projects requested for review
 - 1. Quality Plan: Annual review and approval
 - 2. QAPI projects

NOTE: These projects are completed at the request of the system Board and relate to areas of focus from the strategic plan, the publicly reported data and/or Pay for Performance Measures
